




# Gaps in PIREP System

Our members value PIREPs but, lack confidence in the system

We are NOT seeing an increase in unsolicited PIREP submission





# Efforts to improve

- AOPA is revising SkySpotter online program
  - Point out the multiple users of PIREPS
  - Review how to file
  - Encourage to file routinely, to capture other than just hazardous conditions






#### Barriers

- Not all PIREPs make it into the system
- Not input in a uniform fashion, so may not show up in all PIREP displays






PIREP on the left was not displayed on the AAWU website, probably because information was entered in to REMARKS section, without other fields filled



### Needs to improve system

- End-to-end review of PIREP system
  - Document technical issues
    - Why are some PIREPs failing to be captured in the database and not displayed for all users?
- Pilot training doesn't adequately cover PIREPs
  - Need to set the habits for student pilots
  - Test for PIREPs
- Encourage and incentivize PIREP training
  - FSS solicitation and Wings Credit
- Lack of automation & submission tools for ATC and FSS

# Route Reports



# Route Reports



HRR UA/ /OV HRR 320010 AK06 TTW /TM 2105 /FL045 /TP C185 /SK OVC 055 /TB OCS LGT WX/ FV20+

Making it a *route report* conveys that these conditions were encountered through the mountain pass. Would like to see these displayed graphically.



#### Continued Improvements

- Increase emphasis on PIREPS during flight training
  - Educate on broader uses of PIREPs
  - Practice PIREP filing during training
- Prototype two-way texting of PIREPS, as first step toward automated filing
- Prototype method to graphically display where PIREPS are needed
