

Captain Jonathan Campos had a lifelong dream of becoming a pilot — from an early age, he was drawn to speed, adventure and the skies.

At just nine years old, Jonathan lost his father, a New York City police officer, a loss that deeply shaped his sense of service. He carried his father's badge with him and even had it tattooed on his right shoulder as a lasting tribute.

He enrolled at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University and graduated with a bachelor's degree in 2015, along with commercial pilot and flight instructor certificates. In 2018, Jonathan achieved his goal of flying commercially when he earned a position as a pilot with PSA Airlines. In 2022, he proudly became a Captain. He approached his work with unmatched dedication, finding joy in every flight and every interaction with passengers and crew.

Tragically, on January 29, 2025, Jonathan and 66 others lost their lives when a military helicopter collided midair over the Potomac River with the American Eagle flight he was piloting.

Amazingly, divers recovered his father's badge from the wreckage in the Potomac River. He was laid to rest next to his father at St John's Cemetery in Middle Village, Queens.

I know a great deal about the workings of the air traffic control system in the U.S., the safest and most efficient one on planet Earth. I also have a graduate degree in Aeronautical Science from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, arguably the finest aviation school in the United States, with specialties in Operations and System Safety.
